- **50/50 Raffle** - \$1,606; Laura Swidersky helped with the license and handled ticket printing. Sue Spirko handled ticket sales.
- **Basket Raffle** - \$5,276; Pat Swick and Barb Timko tracked donations. Connie Salisbury stored items and organized the basket wrapping parties which were attended by many creative and energetic people! Pat Swick spearheaded basket assembly and printed lists of items. Marie Walford organized volunteers for the ticket sales. MANY club members donated, wrapped, transported and set up.
