Requirements for the scholarship:

- Cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher
- Must be a graduate of JFK and have attended JFK for a minimum of three years
- Special consideration to students who have overcome a disability or obstacle in life

The Mt. Angel Telecommunications Scholarship

Requirements for the scholarship:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher
- Must be a graduate of JFK and have attended JFK for a minimum of three years

The Katie Westbrook Memorial Scholarship

Requirements for the scholarship:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher
- Must be a graduate of JFK and have attended JFK for a minimum of three years

The Bob Fessler Family Scholarship

Requirements for the scholarship:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher
- Must be a graduate of JFK and have attended JFK for a minimum of three years

The Henrietta T. Saalfeld Scholarship

Requirements for the scholarship:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher
- Must be a graduate of JFK and have attended JFK for a minimum of three years

Awards based solely on the student's effort and demonstrated potential. Funds will be paid directly to the school, its bookstore or similar agency for tuition, books and classroom-required equipment. To maintain eligibility, award recipients must remain regularly enrolled as undergraduate students in good standing.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Submit your request for funding to Mt. Angel Community Foundation through your school counselor, or e-mail your application directly to the MACF Scholarship Coordinator, Bob Kister, at rfkister@gmail.com. **Your completed application packet must be submitted by noon on Monday, April 10, 2017.**

Please staple application packets submitted to your school counselor—a portfolio or report cover is not necessary. **Your application packet must include the following:**

1. A cover page including your name, address, phone number and a durable e-mail address (where MACF can reach you in the future, beyond high school).
2. Community service is an important value to MACF. In your own words, describe what community service means to you, and how it has affected your life.
3. Describe in detail your JFK High School activities (clubs, teams, volunteer programs, etc.) including leadership roles and offices held, and contributions you have made to your high school community. What leadership qualities did you develop through these experiences?
4. Describe in detail your past and present involvement in your neighborhood community (clubs, church or community organizations, volunteer work, etc.). Select one of your most significant community service roles and tell us how that experience influenced your plans for the future.
5. What is your goal(s) in life? Think about your plans for education and career. Explain what you have done and plan to do to achieve your life goal(s), and how an MACF Scholarship could help you accomplish this.
6. Submit up to three letters of recommendation from community members, faculty or administrators who know you well. Recommendation letters should:
 - Specifically relate to your eligibility for this scholarship
 - State how long they have known you, and in what capacity
 - Explain the reason(s) you should be considered for an MACF Scholarship, focusing on your leadership, community service, and character
7. Furnish a transcript of grades (used only for proof of JFK attendance & GPA—eligibility for MACF scholarships is not competitive based on grades).
