Greetings Spelman Sisters!

Welcome to our new monthly newsletter! I am Tara Leigh Buckner, C'87, president of the National Alumnae Association of Spelman College (NAASC). I am so very excited about serving you and all of the opportunities it brings to strengthen our organization and support our beloved Spelman College.

This year, we celebrate the, *quasquicentennial* of the founding of our alumnae association by Clara Howard, C'1892. NAASC is an integral part of how Spelman College achieves its mission. Moreover, our alumnae have been recognized for leading the model of HBCU alumni financial giving, college recruitment and Sisterhood. The theme for the 2016-2017 program year is, "**Living the Legacy of Sisterhood, Service and Success.**" The membership committee has been working very hard to plan and execute a wonderful year of tribute to the work of Sister Clara Howard and NAASC. I plan to build on the hard work of the previous NAASC presidents by focusing on five areas that serve our organization and the College.

1. **Membership! Membership!**

National Membership Chair Diandria Barber, C' 90 is implementing a new strategy that includes expanded services to current and new members. Together with NAASC Vice President and Spelman College Director of Alumnae Affairs Sharon Owens, I will work with Spelman College leadership to strengthen the relationship so that we are exchanging ideas around the needs of the College as well as what is important to all alumnae.

2. **Celebrate the Greatness of NAASC!**

This program year, we will celebrate the 125th Anniversary of the founding of our alumnae association. We honor the first graduates of Spelman Seminary – Ella N. Barksdale, Lou E. Mitchell, Adeline J. Smith, Sallie B. Waugh, Ella L. Williams, and Clara Howard, who became the first president of the Spelman Club. We also acknowledge the incorporation of the NAASC in 1976 – 40 years ago.

3. **Service: Do Something for You...Do Something for Your Community**

Spelman women are about improving the places where they live. We must,

however, take care of ourselves while also providing service to our communities. I would like our chapters take a two prong approach to service. I would like us to "Do something for you and do something for your community."

4. Fundraising for Spelman

We will continue our support of the Donald and Isabel Stewart Endowed Student Scholarship which directly supports our Spelman little sisters. Contributing to DISES is a great way to know your impact on the College. All DISES donations count toward challenge gifts such as your reunion class gift and/or homecoming.

5. Strengthen the Executive Committee and Chapter Operations.

I plan to support chapter operations by improving the effectiveness of the Executive Committee. Building on Immediate Past President Dr. Daphne Smith's work, I will increase the transparency of the Committee's work, via this newsletter and by offering training for NAASC leadership so that we have efficient meetings. NAASC Awards Criteria

Merit Award

- 1. The alumna shall have been out of college for at least five years.**
- Evidence of sustained and/or exceptional service to the college as a volunteer (i.e. student recruiter, outstanding committee work in the association, etc.) shall be presented.
- Evidence of sustained financial support of the college regardless of the amount contributed, or exceptional support in any given year shall be presented.
- Evidence that the alumna has represented the ideals of Spelman College through service to the community; outstanding professional achievement as evidenced by recognition of one's profession or peers, either locally or nationally shall be presented.
- Nominees for this award must meet at least three of the four specified criteria.

Hall of Fame Award

- 1. The alumna shall meet ALL FOUR of the criteria for the Merit Award.**
- In addition to these criteria, the alumna shall possess credentials which evidence national or international recognition and acclaim.

Young Alumna Award

- 1. The alumna shall meet ALL FOUR of the criteria for the Merit Award.**
- In addition to these criteria, the alumna shall not have graduated from Spelman more than 10 years.
