Is this the year you “adopt” some foster tomatoes?

Here’s how it works:

For those of you who have participated in years past,
please note the changes!

- The Flower Farm donates tomato & other veggie plants to Gardens from Garbage to be “fostered” out to local gardeners.
- Each gardener who agrees to adopt a plant (or 20) also agrees to donate back a minimum of 20% of their harvest. That harvest donation will be returned to the **Westside Orchard Garden** and we will deliver it to the Boys & Girls Club, Head Start, and Meals on Wheels kitchens. These combined kitchens prepare app. 800+ meals a week.
- You will pick-up the plants on designated days at the **Westside Orchard Garden (see a map on our website: www.gardensfromgarbage.org)**. If you can’t be there on that day, special arrangements **MUST** be made with Captain Compost (Mike at 868-2359).
- Please dedicate a section of your garden plot to raising veggies for the Foster Tomato Program each season. We’re very grateful you are partnering with us in bringing healthy FRESH food to kitchens in every neighborhood.
