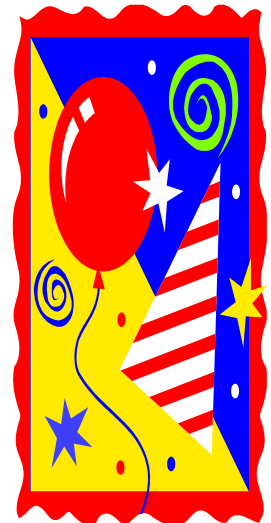

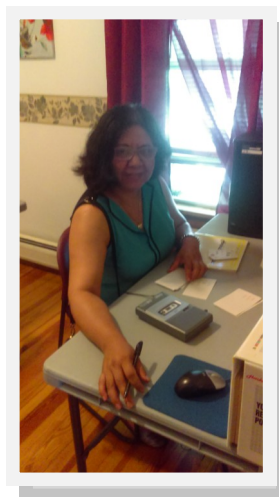
year olds. Here at CHEA Adult Skill Center, adults 25 years of age and older attend programs with other adults.

CHEA Afterschool Program for youth

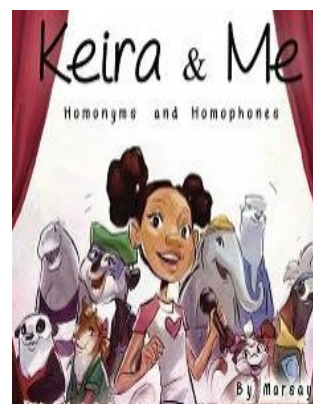
CHEA Adult Skill Center has identified that many enrolled students were either in Special Education courses as a youth, or failed to obtain the basic foundations in reading, English, and writing in elementary. For this reason, CHEA Adult Skill Center has teamed with Dailey Elementary to

offer a afterschool reading & LA program for youth in 2nd-4th grade, who currently struggle academically in the same subjects as enrolled adult learners at the Center.

The four week, two days a week program, held at Dailey School, is designed to help youth in the development of sentence structure,

and reading comprehension. The program utilizes the published educational book, "Keira & Me: Homonyms and Homophones", which is aligned to the Common Core Standards for 2nd-4th grade reading and LA.
