Skate Park Lead Mentor

The Fort Garry Community Centre (FGCC) provides recreation and programming to the community through its two locations at 80 Derek Street and 880 Oakenwald Avenue.

The Skate Park Lead Mentor reports to the General Manager and the Skate Park Supervisor, and is part of a team committed to providing exceptional service and maintaining the Hobson site skate park and surrounding grounds and facilities at the highest quality. Skate Park Mentors oversee use of facilities and grounds and monitors users and equipment. Responsibilities require shifts covering morning, afternoon and evening hours, Monday through Sunday. This is a full-time term position.

The successful candidate must:

- Be age 15 to 30, living in Manitoba and legally entitled to work in Canada (have a valid Social Insurance Number) and have a valid Child Employment Permit if 15 years of age* **
- Be registered as a full-time student during the preceding academic year; intends to return to school on a full-time basis during the next academic year; is a student in a secondary, post-secondary, CEGEP (Quebec only), vocational or technical program**
- Be a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act**
- Demonstrate supervisory skills and familiarity with scheduling and troubleshooting
- Demonstrate intermediate to advanced skateboarding skills (video submission)
- Have sound interpersonal skills with a professional, friendly and calm manner
- Demonstrate good leadership and communication skills
- Be resourceful and has effective troubleshooting skills
- Have enthusiasm and the ability to take initiative when warranted
- Have good time management and organizational skills in a demanding environment
- Be able to work independently and as part of a team
- Have the ability and willingness to complete routine maintenance of facilities, grounds and equipment
- Be physically able to lift, carry and manage equipment and supplies
- Have experience working with children and youth and dealing with the public
- Submit to Child Abuse Registry and Criminal Record checks (cost covered by FGCC) if over the age of 18
- Have Emergency First Aid with CPR Level C (adult, child - 1 & 2 rescuers, infant) with AED (can be acquired within 7 days of start date)
