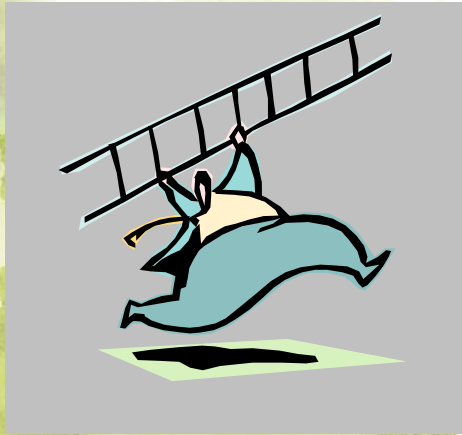

Entitled “Orcas Safe Homes,” the objective is to assist Orcas Island residents to identify and correct safety and health hazards in their living environment.

SAFE HOMES

It will consist of a FREE, extensive, in-home evaluation to identify specific fall hazards, electrical hazards, fire hazards, and other health and personal safety issues in the home.

A set of recommendations will be provided to the resident for their use in correcting health and safety hazards.

Lahari will fund the cost of these home safety evaluations.

There is no obligation on the part of the resident for this free evaluation.

Assistance is available to those who need help in contracting for recommended work.

Lahari will also provide financial assistance for seniors or disabled residents who are otherwise unable to afford to implement the recommendations.
