FAQ's

1. Question: What kind of event is this?

Answer: It's an 8k (4 mile) fun-filled community Walk-A-Thon educational fundraiser.

2. Question: Who is the Dollicia F. Holloway Memorial Foundation, Inc?

Answer: It's more like "what." The Dollicia F. Holloway Memorial Foundation, Inc. is a 501 (c) (3) Public Charity and Educational organization. It was named after my Aunt Dollicia who made several major financial and career related accomplishments before tragically expiring at the tender age of 26 years. 3. Question: What is The H.I.P. H.O.P Movement?

Answer: The H.I.P. H.O.P. Movement is a youth initiative operating under the auspices of The Dollicia F. Holloway Memorial Foundation, Inc. This walk-athon is operating under this program initiative. It stands for Helping Individuals Prosper, Honoring Others Potential = That's H.I.P. H.O.P.!

4. Question: What does it mean to be a tax exempt organization?

Answer: It means that an organization is recognized by the IRS as a public charity where funds donated are exempted from taxes for the contributor at an amount allowable by law. Funds are not subject to taxation.

5. Question: When will this event take place?

Answer: It will take place at 9:30am on Saturday, June 25, 2016. Registration begins at 9:30 am and the walk will commence at 10am.

6. Question: Where will this event take place?

Answer: This event will take place at the Nassau County's Wantagh Park areas 1 & 2

7. Question: Why is this taking place?

Answer: The reason this event is taking place is to create an avenue for graduating college-bound high school seniors to obtain funds to offset the cost of college, perform community service and to bridge the gap between school and community.

8. Question: Who can participate?

Answer: Any citizen of the United States who is a graduating college-bound high school senior that meets the requirements listed in the application. Please go to "Our Programs" tab then to "The Annual Gold Merit Award" subtab to retrieve application.

Besides families of honorees, we are also encouraging free-will walkers to register and join us. We need YOU to WALK with US. Visit our website to register to walk with us on that today.

9. Question: What are the merit award applicant requirements?

Answer:

- A U.S. citizen.
- Be a graduating High School Senior the year application is submitted.
- Recognized as part of the top 25% of their graduating class or hold a grade B average.
- Received or expecting to receive acceptance at an accredited 2 or 4 year college in the United States for the upcoming fall and/or spring semester(s) (must have one for funds to be released).
- Be willing to perform community service during the event which can be used towards their community service high school requirement.

10. Question: How can I obtain an application?

Answer: It can be downloaded from our website. Please go to www.dolliciafholloway.org. Select “Our Programs” tab, from that menu to the “Annual Gold Merit Award” page to retrieve the application.

11. Question: I am a junior. Can I register?

Answer: Not just yet. Try during your senior year. You must be a graduating senior at the time your application is submitted. Any application submitted with a status lower than a senior will not be reviewed and discarded. You will not be notified.

12. Question: I graduated in last year. Can I register?

Answer: No. The student must currently be enrolled in a high school, graduating and accepted or expects to be accepted at an accredited 2 or 4 college or university within the United States at the time application is submitted.

13. Question: What is the application due date?

Answer: The application due date is Saturday, March 26, 2016. If mailed, it must be post marked by this date and addressed to The Dollicia F. Holloway Memorial Foundation, Inc. Visit our website for details: www.dolliciafholloway.org. Applications submitted after or not postmarked by this date will be discarded without notification.

14. Question: How will I know if I am accepted to participate as an honoree?

Answer: You will receive an email notification of acceptance by Saturday, April 2, 2016. If you mailed your application on March 26th, you will be notified no later than Thursday, March 31st. You can expect your H.I.P. H.O.P. Information Kit to arrive within 5 business days via USPS thereafter so you can get started raising funds.

15. Question: How do I obtain monies to have applied to my Gold Merit Award?

Answer: The idea of this Gold Merit Award is for our youth to take charge of their future. Therefore, each "honoree" will solicit "funds of investment" from family, friends, their associated religious assemblies etc. Monies are turned into the Foundation for distribution to the honoree's account that was chosen to be sponsored.

16. Question: Who can make an investment?

Answer: Any individual, business, corporate, not for profit entity or religious entity that is willing to sponsor an honoree and/or the cause.

17. Question: How and where are donations sent to the Foundation?

Answer: Each selected honoree will obtain a personal "GoFundMe" account that will be set up on your behalf by our Foundation so others can invest in your future.

Acceptable forms of payment are: Personal Check, Certified Check or USPS Money Order. Please do not send cash.

18. Question: How will the Foundation distribute monies to honorees?

Answer: Funds will ONLY be distributed directly to the honoree's college of acceptance. The honoree will publically receive a God Merit Award plaque and promotional check to recognize such an honorable effort to take charge of their future during the event. Once mailed, the foundation will contact you with the tracking information by a phone call and email.

19. Question: How much can I raise?

Answer: The amount of money an honoree can raise is unlimited.

20. Question: How much will I receive?

Answer: What you raise equates to the amount you will receive less 5% admin fee from your GOLD Merit Award.

21. Question: Will the check be made out to the honorees?

Answer: No. The check for the award will be made out to the college of choice where the honoree has accepted an invitation.

22. Question: Why are monies being sent to The Dollicia F. Holloway Memorial Foundation, Inc?

Answer: Monies are sent to The Dollicia F. Holloway Memorial Foundation, Inc. to create a safe, honest and legal environment for the collection and distribution of monies. Donors whose amounts allowed by the

fullest extent of the law (IRS) will be tax deductible. This is beneficial to every investor. It's a win-win situation!

23. Question: I am not a student but would like to participate.
