The 4th quarter of 2017 was full for the department. We responded to 140 calls for service. Those calls included 7 structure fires, 53 vehicle accidents, as well as 13 mutual aid calls. 446 Emergency Medical aid runs were dispatched in fourth quarter 2017.

They are called out many times in the middle of the night, and must complete a full circuit of all township roads to make sure residents are as safe as possible during winter weather events. Please keep the following points in mind as we “weather the winter!”

*Crews will plow/salt all roads during bad weather, and then repeat the circuit if snow/ice continues. They must plow all

roads at least once before returning to repeat any.

*Residents are responsible for clearing snow thrown by plows into driveways, and for keeping mailboxes accessible to Postal delivery. See website link.

*Cars parked in cul-de-sacs block plows from removing snow effectively. Please move all vehicles from cul-de-sacs when snow is predicted.

*Use common sense before driving during snowfall event.

Safety Corner

As we are into our inclement weather season the Turtlecreek Township Fire department would like to remind everyone of some safe driving tips for the winter weather.

Take your time – Remember when the roads are slick it takes extra time to stop your vehicle.

Don't slam on your brakes – When braking in winter weather you will not be able to stop as you normally do. Leave enough room between other vehicles so

that you can stop safely.

4 wheel drive may not help – 4 wheel drive will help you go in winter weather but it cannot help you on ice.

ALWAYS LEAVE EXTRA TIME – If winter weather hits remember to leave for your destination early so you don't have to rush and risk losing control of your

vehicle.

Keep extra blankets, hats, and gloves – Make sure that you have extra layers of clothing in case you do end up getting stuck and have to wait for a tow truck or someone to help.

CHARGE YOUR CELL PHONE – always make sure you have a charged cell phone in case you get stuck you can keep
